As we look back & Remember the Fallen we can also begin to look forward to the coming of the King of Peace. Here are 10 Guidelines for Christian living, showing how the Holy Trinity can give us true personal peace in a world in crisis, drawn from Billy Graham's 'Peace with God', 1984.

Read your Bible daily. Hide the Word of God in your heart for His word comforts, guides, corrects, encourages – all that we need is there.

Learn the secret of prayer. Prayer is sharing your life with God. He is your Father. He wants to hear from you, help you and lead you forward. Like a good parent He doesn't always give you what you ask for - you may not be ready for it, or desire it for right motives, or it may not be good for you. Trust God & never give up praying.

Let the Holy Spirit grow you. You are a temple of the Holy Spirit. He wants to transform your life from self-focused to God-centred. Discover and use the gifts He gives you to do His will, and let Him mature you in His character - His fruit - so like you may live Christ's life and do Christ's work in God's way.

Attend PBC church regularly. The visible church is Christ's organization upon earth. Christians need one another, we need to gather together to worship God and nothing can take the place of church attendance. It grieves the Holy Spirit when we choose to do many things rather than meet with & worship with our church.

Be a witnessing Christian. We witness by how we live in Christ and by the story of Christ in our life.

Live your life through love. Not romance, not family, not affection for things but love for others. The only thing that counts is faith expressed in love.

Be an obedient Christian. Let what pleases God have 1st place in all you do.

Learn to stand against temptation. Temptation is not sin. It is *yielding* that is sin. Let Christ through the Holy Spirit do the fighting for you.

Be a wholesome Christian. Our lives and appearance should commend the Gospel and make it attractive to others.

Live above your circumstances. Don't let your circumstances get you down. Learn to live graciously within them, realizing the Lord Himself is with you.

And we might add, when we see each other slipping up: help, encourage, and support the other, and may we let them sustain us when we slip.
